"Blessed Assurance" is a well-known Christian hymn. The lyrics were written in 1873 by blind hymn writer Fanny Crosby to the music written that same year by Phoebe Knapp.

The tune was written first, then the lyrics. Knapp played the tune to Crosby - remember she is blind.

When Knapp asked Crosby, "What do you think the tune says?", Crosby replied, "Blessed assurance; Jesus is mine." ... The popular song reflects Crosby's walk of faith, as expressed by the apostle Paul in Philippians 1:21, "For to me, to live is Christ and to die is gain" (ESV).

As a young Christian, my first Tamborine convention was 1954/55, having heard about it through Worldwide Evangelisation Crusade (WEC). I subsequently attended the conventions in 1955/56 at Eagle Heights, Mt Tamborine then 1956/57 and 1957/58 at Indooroopilly. In those days the convention ran from Christmas to New Year.

In 1954 I stayed at the WEC house party at Bungunya (today known as "The Manor" on Long Road), arriving the day before things started. So, Gerhard invited me to join him to listen to a tape he had received from Prairie Bible Institute (which he had attended) of that year's graduation. Ron Barham, who designed and built the original amplifier for the convention PA system and was also responsible for recording the messages, arrived brining with him the necessary tape-recorder. I was unaware then that I was meeting the man who would one day be my husband.

Memories have faded over the years, but it seems to me that there was quite a bevy of young people staying at WEC (in Bungunya) led by the Bargens. We would all troop around to the big marquee at Eagle Heights where the meetings were held, there to listen to speakers such as Canon Marcus Loane and join in singing the great Keswick hymns.

Back at WEC there was wonderful fellowship around the meal table. After meals, time was spent sharing testimonies and having singalongs of favourite hymns and choruses, energetically accompanied at the piano by Bert Kilvert, who adapted one of the choruses to suit the occasion.

"It is glory just to walk with Him, Through the vale and o'er the height" became "Through the vale and Eagle Heights".

It's true I have wonderful memories from the early days at the Eagle Hts Conventions, but to return here to the present Convention site for the Seniors' Get-Away last November, and to hear and see what is happening today; I give thanks for God's using MTCC all these years.

Hope Devotion by Joel Prange Operations Manager, Church & Community Engagement Officer

Today I would like to talk to you about hope. The worldly definition of hope is a feeling of expectation and desire for a particular thing to happen. Our Christian definition of hope is anchored in Christ. For without Christ, you can have no hope.

You can have a superficial hope, but this fades in the face of tragedy and death. For those in Christ, we have a hope in a future that surpasses death, so our hope is not diminished in the face of death, rather it is strengthened.



The entire Bible points to and speaks of this hope in Jesus Christ. And it is this hope that sustains us during adversity. 2 Corinthians 4:16-18 says this "So we do not lose heart. Though our outer self is wasting away, our inner self is being renewed day by day. For this light momentary affliction is preparing for us an eternal weight of glory beyond all comparison, as we look not to the things that are seen but to the things that are unseen. For the things that are seen are transient, but the things that are unseen are eternal." Here we can draw a comparison with what is happening here in Queensland. Although business confidence is down, we can be assured and have hope that God is working all things together for good.

Romans 5:5 also tells us "and hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us." So, let us never be ashamed of our hope in Christ, but rather use our position here on the mountain to keep spreading God's good news. Moreover, 1 Peter 1:3 states "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! According to his great mercy, he has caused us to be born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead." So, our hope is a living hope that goes beyond the grave.

This hope allows us to live in this world that seems to have no hope. We can share this hope with others so they too will have the hope of salvation. It also permeates our lives and all we do and becomes the light that others see and ask why we continue to have hope when things seem so dire.

The core purpose of Mount Tamborine Convention (MTC) is to see as many people as possible experience a life-changing encounter with Jesus Christ, not just those attending conventions but all who come onto the property.

MTC is a Letters Patent body which is a form of corporate identity granted under the religious Educational and Charitable Institutions Act of 1861. The Associations repealed this Act and the Incorporations Act in 1981 but its operations as far as the existing Letters Patent bodies were concerned was protected and preserved by the 1981 Act.

The concept of Membership with a Christian organisation or church includes principles that distinguish the relationship from those of many secular organisation memberships. For MTC members, there is an important spiritual element. The Kingdom of God is at the heart of the commitment.

Members provide three critical roles:

- Maintaining and enhancing accountability for the Board to lead, based on MTC's Core Values
- Ownership of the Vision, Mission and Core Values, thrusting MTC into a successful future
- Engaging by providing useful skills to support the organisation
