Auditorium	Waking up to woke: What does the Bible say about true and false righteousness? (Panel) Modern society is filled with intense debates about the nature of right and wrong. New words such as 'woke' have been used to criticise trends perceived as intolerant and hypocritical. In response, it is vital for Christians to understand what the Bible says about true and false righteousness, discerning what is truly important to God as opposed to the false or trivial. Finally, we will discuss how Christians can talk with unbelievers, speaking the truth in love while avoiding toxic arguments.

Camp Tamborine	Fearfully and wonderfully made: Parenting under 6s through a biblical framework. Based on the acknowledgement that we are indeed "fearfully and wonderful made" (Psalm 139:14), this interactive session explores child development in the early years and what this means for us as parents. Each developmental concept and related parenting approach is linked to what the Bible teaches about human relationships and how we can live out our faith in our roles as parents through the early years.

Do you ever feel like there's no place for you in the Church if you don't play a guitar or know a bunch of youth games? Sometimes, our vision for Christ's kingdom is too small. Join me as we open the Bible to see that Christ's vision for the Church is nothing less than a symphony of many different instruments. We'll help you to see that you were made to serve Jesus from your unique strengths.

Tamborine Lodge	Defending your faith: why trust the Bible's authority? With a constant stream of sceptical critics and our awareness of so many other religious texts, why do Christians believe that the Bible is the inspired word of God? This session will explore 4 independent lines of argument used to show that there are divine fingerprints all over Scripture that can buoy our Christian confidence.

Auditorium	Women and the comparative cycle (Panel) Comparing yourself to others is a natural tendency but the many societal pressures that women face today can leave one feeling inadequate and just not making the mark. This elective will explore where these pressures are coming from and the impact they are having on women and their families. A panel of three women in different seasons of life will engage in an open and honest dialogue about the reality of the comparison cycle and what women can do to support each other and find their unique worth in Christ.

WEC (stage end of dining room)	Men and friendship evangelism I love helping men meet Jesus, but I don't find it easy. I tried lots of things and made lots of mistakes, but I haven't given up! In one hour, we'll have an honest conversation about the challenges and the opportunities for reaching men with the gospel. My hope is that you'll leave the session keen to keep speaking about Jesus to the men around you.

Camp Tamborine	Developing an intimate relationship with God So many of the words God uses to describe his relationship with us suggest intimacy – words like Father, beloved, friend, comforter, teacher, guide, shepherd – and yet it is easy for us to live our Christian life feeling at a distance from God, knowing about Him, but not really knowing him personally. Join us as we explore what the Bible has to say about intimacy with God, and as we look at different ways that we can get to know Him better. Jesus promised that his sheep would know his voice. We will consider how the Bible tells us he might speak, and how we can be sure that it is really Him.
