Kate Pocklington's story of mission starts when, as a young child, she headed to the Philippines with her family. Knowing from an early age that God would have her involved in mission, she attended the Melbourne School of Theology after school, and then went to the USA for further study in mission and Biblical studies. In 2003, she went with Pioneers to live and serve in Delhi, India. There, as part of a local church team, she ministered in a slum doing a mix of community development and church planting. On her return to Australia 8 years later, she led the Training & Development team at Pioneers National Office in Melbourne for 7 years. Soon after completing a Doctorate of Intercultural Studies, she joined the Oceania Regional Team to serve in the area of Leadership Development & Mission Formation. Her first book, Shaped by the Spirit: Being Formed into an Outwardfocused People will be released on May 16, 2024. Kate is an adjunct

lecturer at the Melbourne School

of Theology and lives in Melbourne.

Nathan Reid has spent the last 28 years serving in various roles in pastoring local churches and mission organizations. He has served as a youth and young adult pastor in urban and regional NSW and as a cross-cultural pastor in multicultural northwest Sydney. A short-term trip to an Islamic minority group in Central Asia. when he was serving as a youth pastor, sparked his heart for Global Mission and Gospel marginalized peoples. This led to many more trips across Southeast Asia and into national roles with Baptist Mission Australia.
